Ash Wednesday emphasizes a dual encounter: we confront our own mortality and confess our sin before God within the community of faith. The form and content of the service focuses on the dual themes of sin and death in the light of God's redeeming love in Jesus Christ.

This year, we are observing this special day in a different way. Our church sanctuary will be open from Noon– 7pm and various places around the sanctuary will have Scripture readings, a brief devotional from Pastor Chuck and the communion elements of bread and juice. They will be prepared in a safe manner for all folks. Come and sit as long as you desire, reflect on the goodness and sacrifice of our Lord and prepare for the Lenten season.
